To encourage creativity and imaginative play along with skill-based learning, here are some hands-on activity suggestions for the week

Number Zero Buddy

Materials Required :

- Number Zero cutouts made out of chart paper
 - 1 for face (Yellow)
 - 2 for eyes (Black)
 - 1 for nose (orange)
 - 1 for mouth (red)
- Ice Cream Stick

How to

- The child to identify the number of zero cutouts and the colours of the zero cutouts
- Encourage the child to paste the cutouts in their proper place.
- Encourage the child to paste the ice cream stick to make their number Zero buddy


Block Play

Materials Required:

- Building Blocks
- Pre-written letter 'v' and the number zero on two A4 sheets

How to

- Let the child identify the number zero and letter v
- Encourage the child to place blocks on the number zero to learn the number formation
- Encourage the child to place blocks on the letter v to learn the formation and directionality

Letter 'v' Collage

Materials Required:

- Chart paper – A3 size
- Pictures from magazines – letter 'v' sound objects like violin, van, vase, vegetables, volcano, etc.
- A pair of child –safe scissors
- Glue stick

How to

- The parent to help the child by providing magazines for the child to identify letter 'v' sound objects
- Encourage the child to cut out the pictures
- Let the child arrange the pictures on an A3 sheet and form a collage.
